



Southern Regional Headquarters, Barra, Mindanao Construction Begins!

Praise the Lord,

Eld. Regino Barrero, Mindanao pastors and the saints of Bulua and Lanisi began construction on phase one of the Southern Regional Headquarters in Barra in Mindanao. What a great joy to report this wonderful victory.

When I first visited Mindanao in October of 1975, I felt a great burden for Cagayan de Oro city, the principal city of Northern Mindanao. In 1984, my family and I moved to Bulua, a suburb of Cagayan de Oro City to start a new church which would serve as headquarters for Mindanao. While there, I was stricken with septic shock, staph pneumonia, a profusely bleeding ulcer and a few other problems. The doctors said I could not live, but God willed otherwise and the US Air Force air-lifted me off the island with DC-9 Med Evac plane.

The church I started in Bulua struggled for several years until Eld. Barrero became pastor there, a number of years ago. Under his guidance, the church grew and the Fellowship in Mindanao has become the best we have ever had in Mindanao. In the past few years, Eld. Barrero and the churches of Mindanao fought hard battles against strong opposition from the entrenched powers of the occult that are pervasive in that region. After over a year of intense prayer and fasting, God gave a great victory to our Fellowship in that region. The sword of the Lord visited the area and some died, but God rewarded the faith and fervent prayers of these dedicated people.

Several months ago, Eld. Phil White and the church in Burbank, CA gave funds to build phase one of the regional headquarters. These facilities will be used for the Bulua (Barra and Bulua are adjacent subdivisions) congregation as well as a regional training center and conference facilities. The land here has already been paid for, thanks to the generosity of several churches. This is a very beautiful piece of property which is situated along the main highway and lies between the city and the new international airport which is slated to be opening soon.


Eld. Barrero kicked off the construction project with three days of prayer and fasting for his church and the Fellowship. We rejoice to see the wonderful progress on this important project. Several area pastors came to help start the first week. Most of the men in the Bulua congregation took off work for one week to donate their labor. Eld. Barrero, who has had many years of construction experience, said they were able to accomplish as much in one week as he had expected to accomplish in two weeks. He reports wonderful harmony among his church and the Fellowship.

Since so many have provided so much volunteer help, Eld. Barrero has only had to hire a few men from the outside. You will be impressed as you see the pictures and read Eld. Barrero's reports on this project. It is very touching to see a 78-year-old grandmother carrying cement blocks – one in each hand.
